## Beaches Fine Arts Series Announces New Duathlon

The 2008 Beaches Fine Arts Sprint Triathlon Series, scheduled for May 17, June 14 and July 12, will add a new race this season. A duathlon, with a 2-mile run followed by a 12-mile bike ride and finishing with a 2-mile run will be held on Saturday, April 19, at 8:00 a.m. in the Town of Nocatee at Crosswater Parkway off CR 210 in Ponte Vedra. Proceeds go toward the 36<sup>th</sup> season of the Beaches Fine Arts Series, which presents to the North Florida community eight free world-class musical performances annually.

The duathlon race is limited to 400 participants and 15 team spots. For individuals, the cost varies from \$40-\$70 depending on age, USA Triathlon (USAT) membership and date of registration. There is a discount for those who sign up before March 31. For teams, the cost is \$110-\$140.

The duathlon begins promptly at 8:00 a.m. and athletes are expected to be on the bike course starting at about 8:15 a.m. until about 9:30 a.m. St. John's County Sheriff's Office deputies and race officials, organizers and volunteers will be monitoring the course. Organizers ask that vehicles traveling in the area exercise extra caution on race day.
